OFFICE MEMORANDUM

SUB: Cadre Allocation of CMSE – 2011 candidates – reg.

The undersigned is directed to say that the Union Public Service Commission have recommended and forwarded dossiers of 352 candidates (including 46 belonging to Scheduled Caste, 29 belonging to Scheduled Tribe, 121 belonging to Other Backward Classes (including 03 PH) and 156 General candidates (including 08 Physically Handicapped) who have been declared successful on the basis of the final result of the Combined Medical Services Examination - 2011 to the following services/posts: -

1. Assistant Divisional Medical Officer in the Railways.
2. Junior Scale Posts in Indian Ordnance Factories Health Service.
3. Junior Scale Posts of Medical Officers in Central Health Service.
4. Medical Officers in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi.
5. G.D.M.O. in New Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC).

2. The total number of vacancies as intimated by the concerned Ministries, MCD and NDMC is 387 including 46 for Scheduled Castes, 29 for Scheduled Tribes, 121 for OBC Category and 15 Physically Handicapped. A photocopy of the vacancy statement is enclosed for reference at **Annexure – I**. The recommendations of the Commission have been received vide their letter No.F.1/5/2011-E.XIII dated 30.09.2011 (**Annexure-II**) and may be seen for necessary action and compliance. The 34 OBC and 1 SC candidate whose names are given in **Annexure-III** have come up in the General merit and are to be considered at par with the general candidates in the matter of allocation of services subject to the provisions of Rule 13 of CMSE-2010 rules.

3. The relevant details containing name, roll number, rank number, status of medical examination and attestation forms are given in the enclosed list (**Annexure-IV**). The respective dossiers of the candidates are also enclosed.

4. The UPSC have also indicated the roll numbers of some candidates (as indicated in **Annexure-V**, and **Annexure-VI** to their letter) who are required to submit some original documents. The candidates whose roll numbers are given in **Annexure-VI** of the said letter have to submit certain documents in original or yet to satisfy certain other requirements of the rules as indicated against their Roll Nos. The documents shown against these conditional candidatures need not be sent to the Commission and the same as and when received from the candidates may be verified by the respective Ministry/Department to which the candidate is allocated. However, on this account their appointment, if they are otherwise eligible, **need not be withheld**. **Annexure-V** of the said letter indicates the roll numbers of candidates whose candidature is still provisional and who have to submit some original documents including SSLC/ Caste Certificate in certain cases. It may be noted that the offer of appointment **should not be made**

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to candidates whose roll numbers are given in **Annexure-V** and whose candidature is provisional, unless the documents required in their cases have been obtained and sent to the commission for verification and clearance obtained. The concerned cadre authorities are requested to correspond with UPSC directly in the matter of verification of documents of candidates as mentioned in **Annexure-V**.

5. Keeping in view the number of vacancies intimated, rank obtained by the candidates, preference(s) given by the candidates etc. the candidates (including that of reserved categories) recommended by the Commission have been allocated as under: -

- # This includes allocation of 26 OBC candidates against unreserved vacancies on their having qualified in general merit. There is a shortage of 16 (4 UR and 12 OBC) candidates. 7 Physically Handicapped category candidates have also been allocated against vacancies reserved for them.
- ¥ This includes 2 OBC candidates who qualified against unreserved vacancies. There is a shortage of 11 (3 UR and 8 OBC) candidates. 01 Physically Handicapped category candidate has also been allocated against vacancy reserved for him.
- @ There is a shortage of 8 OBC candidates. 3 Physically Handicapped category candidates have also been allocated against vacancies reserved for them.

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6. Complete Medical Examination of the successful candidates of the CMSE-2011 was done at the time of interview by Ministry of Health &FW. Candidates, whose medical reports are not placed in the dossiers, may be asked to appear before the Medical Board of the respective cadre.
7. The formality regarding the verification of character and antecedents of each of these candidates may also please be completed by the concerned cadre controlling authority on the basis of the attestation form (placed in the dossiers) as and when received and to be called for from the candidates wherever the same have not been received. Status about receipt of Attestation Forms from the candidates concerned has been indicated in column **7 of Annexure-IV.**
8. The candidates may be appointed after completion of formalities of their medical examination and the verification of their character and antecedents and also after obtaining clearance from the UPSC in respect of the candidates whose candidature is provisional as per details given in Annexure-V. In some cases clearances from UPSC have also been received and the same have been added to the concerned dossier.
9. The copies of the SC/ST/OBC certificates submitted by the candidates claiming to be belonging to these communities have been added to their respective dossiers. The claim of these candidates to belong to SC/ST/OBC has been accepted by the UPSC on the basis of the original certificates produced by them. As the cases have occurred where candidates had obtained SC/ST/OBC certificates even though they did not actually belong to those communities, it is, therefore, requested that necessary action may be taken to verify the veracity of these documents positively before making offer of appointment to the candidate concerned. Also, there may be some cases where though OBC certificates have been issued to the candidates, the "creamy layer" status may be doubtful keeping in view the income/status of the parents of the candidates as per declaration of the candidates in column 16 of the Detailed Application Form. These candidates have been provisionally treated as OBC candidates subject to the Govt. satisfying themselves about genuineness of their OBC claim. Before appointing such candidates, it may be ensured that they do not attract "Creamy Layer" provisions.
10. Since the appointment of the concerned candidate is subject to the candidates satisfying the appointing authority of his/her having satisfactorily completed the Compulsory Rotating Internship, the Cadre Controlling Authority should ensure and satisfy themselves before the candidates are appointed only after completing the Compulsory Rotating Internship satisfactorily. A copy of the offer of appointment as and when issued to the concerned candidates, after completion of all formalities as indicated above, may please be endorsed to the Union Public Service Commission who may also be informed as soon as the candidates join duty. The copy of offer of appointment is not required to be sent to this Ministry. In addition to this the Assessment Reports on the work and performance of candidates appointed should be made available to UPSC every year for a period of two years subsequent to their appointment. The concerned candidates may also be informed of their being allocated to the respective cadres.

11. The allocation of Physically Handicapped candidates have been done on the basis of functional classification and number of vacancies identified by the different cadre authorities and intimated to Union Public Service Commission.
